



Additional notes regarding Angelfish

Angelfish are popular companion fish for a group of discus fish.

We advise against Angelfish as companion fish. Angelfish are usually infected with tapeworms, and although Angelfish can cope well with them, these tapeworms can cause serious problems for discus fish. In addition, Angelfish often eat more greedily than discus fish, making feeding more difficult for the discus fish.

If you wish to keep Angelfish as companion fish in your discus aquarium despite this, please be sure to treat your Angelfish for tapeworm as described in the last paragraph of this section, before adding them to your aquarium.

Treating Angelfish for tapeworm:

Tapeworm has a major adverse effects on discus fishes' health and growth. Our **STENKDER** Discus Fish are always delivered tapeworm-free, but are not likely to remain so, with Angelfish as companion fish.

In our opinion, the only way you can combine these two species is to initially treat the Angelfish for tapeworm, only adding them to your discus fish aquarium once the treatment is complete.

How to treat Angelfish for tapeworm:

Use Tremazol or other Parziquantel-based medicines as described in the directions for use on the product.
